### **Adult Apprenticeship is Affordable:**

- Tuition is free.
- Registration fees are \$450-700/level.
- Rural apprentices receive a transportation or living allowance.
- Employment Insurance Apprentices can be claimed during technical training.
- On the job learning time is paid.
- At least \$4000 in grants are available for completing levels (in the Red Seal Trades).
- The costs of their books and living expenses must be paid by the apprentice.

The High School Apprenticeship Program (HSAP) is a work experience credit. Students are trained on-the-job by a qualified trades person. Students earn school credits, get paid and gain apprenticeship hours.

# Students Can Start Their Career in High School

### **High School Apprentices:**

- May acquire up to 8—Grade 12 High School credits.
- Earn minimum wage plus 10%.
- Collect work experience hours that count towards trade certification.
- Gain valuable trade knowledge and skills.
- Learn employability skills like being on time, showing initiative, and work ethic.




### How to Get Started:

- Find employment in a trade (contact family and friends as well as introduce themselves to employers in person with a resume and cover letter).
- Be at least 16 years old .
- Contact a HSAP Teacher and fill out the necessary forms.
- Students may work in the evenings and during school breaks.



**After High School:** 

- Apprentices continue to learn on the job and collect work experience hours.
- Apprentices typically work for 10 months each year, and then attend technical training through Apprenticeship Manitoba at either Red River College or Assiniboine Community College to complete a level of training.
- Apprentices complete 2-5 levels of training depending on the trade they choose.
- Completion of apprenticeship results in Red Seal Journeyperson and/or a licensed trades person certification.
- Apprentices must register for technical training with Apprenticeship Manitoba.
